The Theodore Boone Files 3: THEO IN DEPTH

Talking points

What have you noticed about:

1. Theo's home life

- What does being an only child mean for him?
- What does having two very busy high-achieving parents mean for him?
- How does the family organise itself?
- Do his parents treat him like a child?

2. Theo's friendships

- Who are the most important people in Theo's life, besides his parents?
- What do the following people offer Theo in his life: April, Chase, Ike, Elsa.

3. Theo's school life

- What does Theo learn at school that will help him in his future as a lawyer?
- How important is it to him to succeed at school?
- How does he feel about his schoolwork?
- How do his teachers support him? Give examples from any of the books that you have read.

4. Theo's beliefs and role models

- What does Theo learn about the law from (a) his mother, (b) his father, (c) Ike, (d) Judge Gantry, (e) Judge Yeck?
- Would Theo break the law or work outside the law to get the result that he believes to be right?
- What skills or abilities does Theo have already that will be useful in any career?
- What spare time activities does he take part in and how do they make him a better lawyer?

- Write Theo a reference for an internship with a top law firm that he would like to work for before he goes to law school. State why they need to employ him.
